Summary of Performance Standards "Goals and Results"

- (a) 80% of participants reviewed were able to identify all the chess pieces, how each piece moves, and how each piece attacks. (goal was 75% of all participants)
- (b) 70% of all participants will be able to recall the food groups of the USDA "MyPlate". (goal was 75%)
- (c) 50% of participants were able to recall at least one of the three elements of the BYEF definition of teamwork and two of the five principles of sportsmanship. (goal was 75%)
- (d) 85% of the students participating in basketball were able to successfully execute the triple threat position (goal was 75%)
- (e) 100% of the basketball participants were able to execute a defensive position on man with the ball not in scoring position. (goal was 75%)
- (f) 100% of the participants were able to successfully execute throwing and catching a chess pass and bounce pass. (goal was 75%)
- (g) 80% of participants were able to identify examples of foods in the USDA MyPlate Food groups (goal was 50%)

Nutrition Education Instructor Joseph Clark from the St. Louis University School of Nutrition and Dietetics guided program participants from Stix and Nance through two six USDA Myplate lesson plans and instructed them on preparing the day's healthy snack.





2023 Reading Riders

This year representatives from the Torch Bearers 2 and Eastside Heart and Home Family Center joined volunteers from BYEF in recruiting club members for the Reading Riders 2023 adventures.

Six females, ages 6, 7, 7, 9, 11 and 15 participated in the club. They were joined with nineteen males participated ranging 7, 7,7,7, 8, 8, 8, 9, 10, 10, 11, 13, 13, 13, 14, 14, 14, and 16. Nine parents and one grandparent joined in the fun on at least one of the trail rides.

Two St. Louis Ready Reader West End Neighborhood Block Captain volunteers coordinated and conducted the reading component of this year's club.

The reading activities included reading from, Don't Throw It To MO and Swim MO Swim by David Adler, Juneteenth by Floyd Cooper, Katie Fry Private Eye The Lost Kitten by Katherine Cox and a reading scavenger hunt for points at the interpretive center at the Lewis and Clark Historic Site in Hartford, Illinois.

Manchester United Methodist Church Bike Rehab donated 21 bikes to the program. The club escaped the hottest part of the 2023 St. Louis summer but the discounted water bottle racks from St. Louis BWorks were greatly appreciated.

BYEF general program funds, club program fees (\$25 per club member), plus grant funds from the Spark Grant awarded by the League of American Bicyclists and the Feuerbacker Grant awarded by the Carondelet Sisters of St. Joseph's covered the costs to conduct this year's club.




