# Donations & Funding Acknowledgement

Bike Rehab Manchester United Methodist Church donated 21 bikes to the program. The club escaped the hottest part of the 2023 St. Louis summer but the discounted water bottle racks from St. Louis BWorks were greatly appreciated.

This year's club activities were made possible by BYEF general program funds, club program fees (\$25 per club member), plus grant funds from the Spark Grant awarded by the League of American Bicyclists and the Feuerbacker Grant awarded by the Carondelet Sisters of St. Joseph.

### Participants Summary

This year Bailey Youth Enrichment Foundation volunteers were joined by representatives from St. Louis, Missouri Torch Bearers 2 and the East St. Louis, Illinois Eastside Heart and Home Family Center in recruiting club members for the Reading Riders' 2023 adventures.

The efforts of the recruitment teams resulted in six females (ages 6, 7, 7, 9, 11 and 15) participating in the club. The young ladies were joined by nineteen male participates (ages 7, 7,7,7, 7, 8, 8, 8, 9, 10, 10, 11, 13, 13, 13, 14, 14, 14, and 16. Nine parents and one grandparent also joined in the fun.



#### Commencement Weekend





In Today's bike ride, it really was a challenge because my knees was hurting bad on the hills


